

West Berkshire Directory website



What is the West Berkshire Directory?

The Directory is free, available online, and gives details of the wide range of information, advice and support that's available across West Berkshire for adults, families and children. It includes lists of useful phone numbers, email addresses and websites of local and national organisations.

The Directory is easy to use and gives anyone an important first point of contact for many support networks. There is a huge amount of advice and support out there along with so many organisations and community groups running events and activities in our area, the Directory gives people the first step towards accessing all this knowledge and all these networks.

There are around 2000 records that are continually being updated, which includes news, advice and guidance articles, training events, social activities and much more.

And it is different to the West Berkshire Council website because.....

The Directory provides records, news articles of internal and external organisations and events. GP practices (via Social Prescribers) in the local area are working towards signposting patients towards the Directory and have a dedicated section on their website.

West Berkshire is fortunate to have a diverse range of support services available which are provided by all kinds of organisations, the voluntary sector and individuals.

We are rich in community based resources, the Directory brings together information on activities and opportunities which can enhance all aspects of our lives.

Why do we need one?

The Adults Social Care information Point (SCiP) went live in 2011, initially to meet obligations under the Transformation of the Adult Social Care agenda and latterly complied with the Care Act (2014) requirements. The Family Information Service (FIS) was part of a charity that was taken on by WBC in 2011 and the Local Offer was first established in 2014.

There is also a statutory duty for every authority to provide a Family Information Service & SEND Local Offer information site.

The Social Care information Point sat on a separate platform to the Family information service and SEND Local Offer sites. The 3 sites have now been incorporated into the one West Berkshire Directory.

Who is it aimed at?

Are you a parent worried about your child and needing someone to talk to? Or maybe you're caring for a friend or relative feeling isolated and want to know what sort of support is available in your community. Are you looking for a youth club for your child with autism?

For adults there is information about a range of resources in your community that can help you remain independent or feel less isolated. This includes information about leisure activities and local support groups which run events that could help you get out more and make new friends.

SEND Local Offer supports families with children and young people aged from 0-25, providing information on activities, education, health, travel and money matters. All these areas of the Directory have many records that provide a mine of valuable information.

These sections provide a wealth of information on childcare, Early Years Funding, leisure activities, support services and much more including a telephone line offering free help and advice for parents, parents-to-be, carers and professionals.

Who contributes?

The Local Authority has many entries of its own services in the Directory and many other entries which could be from any type of organisation or individual offering a service.

If you know of a local organisation or community group providing a service or activities for anyone living in West Berkshire, they can submit their entry into the Directory and will be responsible for maintaining its accuracy. The Directory is updated almost daily.

West Berkshire, a great place to live with great amenities, do you know what's on offer for you and your family?

The answers to all these questions, and more, are now available at the touch of a button in the West Berkshire Directory, which brings together a wealth of information in the Adults, Family Information Service and SEND Local Offer sections.

We are keen to raise the profile of the West Berkshire Directory with users and contributors.

The Disabled Children's Register

West Berkshire's Disabled Children Register (DCR) is a secure database which aims to capture information about all children and young people aged 0-25 years with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) in West Berkshire. The information that you give us will be used anonymously to show the use of and demand for services in West Berkshire. We will use this information to help us to plan, monitor and develop appropriate facilities and services for disabled children and their families.

The DCR is managed by the West Berkshire Directory. Registering is voluntary but we would like to encourage as many of you as possible to register so that we can get as clear a picture as possible of the needs for services in West Berkshire. To register you must complete a simple online form which will allow you to provide us with details of your child. We will be able to use your contact details to keep you up-to-date with developments in services and other relevant information for disabled children and young people.

<u>WOW+ Supported Internship</u> <u>Programme</u>



Supported internships are work-based learning placements within employment settings. The skills gained will give you a greater chance of securing paid employment or an apprenticeship after you complete the programme.

Entry Requirements Summary

This programme is designed for young people with moderate learning difficulties or disabilities. You must be aged 18 - 24 with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and be eligible to work in the UK. Enthusiasm for the world of work, with employment being the main focus, is a must. Prior work experience is critical. Specific entry requirements are available with the application pack.





What are supported internships?

Our one year full time supported internship programme helps young people with additional support needs to move into employment; learning new skills in a supportive atmosphere. Throughout the programme students benefit from the support of an experienced Job Coach, specialising in helping those with additional support needs to undertake work placements with an employer. We will identify the best employer to support your career ambitions as a part of vocational profiling. Most students continue working towards Maths and English qualifications and everyone will get the chance to do training courses that matters in the workplace and are valued by employers like First Aid and Health and Safety.



John's Journey

John is 19 and has been taking part in World of Work activities- he is currently on the WOW+ Supported Internship. John has completed extended work placements at Sainsburys, Tesco and is now placed at Donnington Valley. John works independently at Donnington Valley with support from his Job Coach when he needs it and help from his colleagues. John has developed the skills he needs to work in the restaurant at Donnington Valley from serving customers, preparing hot and cold drinks and clearing tables. John's Manager says 'Having John here has been brilliant, he is a hard worker and a valued member of our team'. John is hoping to get paid employment at Donnington Valley when he finishes WOW+.

Over the summer holiday, in addition to our holiday courses that are inclusive and can be adapted for access needs, The Watermill Theatre ran specifically designed holiday courses for young people with additional needs. Our course, Story Adventures, welcomed young people of primary school age to explore an imaginary circus of their own creation. More Story Adventures are planned for the school holidays next year so keep your eyes peeled for those events! Young people of secondary school age attended Discover Kiss Me, Kate, learning about our summer musical and the Shakespeare play it features, before watching the show together. Here they are together with the Watermill cast at the end of the show!

Throughout the year The Watermill Theatre runs weekly groups and special events for young people and adults of all ages and abilities. Maybe Ad Lib would be right for you! Or Duologue is our weekly group bringing together D/deaf and hearing people to create theatre.

If you or someone in your family has a sensory sensitivity, autism, dementia, or finds it challenging to be in a conventional theatre environment, our Relaxed Performances are there to support you. For people with a visual impairment The Watermill also offers Audio Described performances with a free pre-show Touch Tour, and we have BSL sign integrated performances for Deaf audiences.


